A POLITE FEW REMINDERS:

Dog Fouling: Dog fouling bins are provided for your use (along with bags should you have run out of them on your

walk or forgotten them at home). The Parish Council have arranged for these bins to be emptied twice weekly. Please make use of them. Thank you.

Hedgerow Cutting: Please can we remind residents to trim any hedgerows or vegetation that overhangs onto public rights of way or footpaths (particularly along the High Street where footpaths are particularly narrow). Of course, please ensure that you are able do this safely.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

■he Parish Council Annual Meeting was held in Fentham Hall on 24th May with 75 Parishioners, two Ward Councillors and nine Parish Councillors present to hear about the work of the Parish Council over the preceding 12 months. This was the best attended event for many years and it was great to see so many residents present.

The main business was a lively discussion on the parking issues caused by the recent opening of Soho Tavern and residents were assured that the Council had not been complacent about the problem and the various measures in progress were explained.

So, another Hampton in Arden Festival has come and gone and what a fabulous event it was! The Festival is all about community, bringing together the different groups, organisations and businesses in one place and giving them the opportunity to raise awareness, funds and to give something back. As a volunteer core committee of just three, backed up by a wonderful group of supporters (too many to name, but you know who you are), we organise this Festival for the whole village, trying to ensure there is something for everyone.



During the day, we had more cars, more stallholders, more people (around 1,500!), more live music and more fun than ever before. Then, in the evening, we had live music from a variety of local, upcoming bands before our headline act, 2 Weeks Notice, put on a show that had over 800 of you dancing and singing your hearts out.

We are pleased to announce that your contributions have raised approximately £10,000, which will be put back into our community (more details to follow). Thank you!

Residents are also reminded that dogs are not allowed in the play area or on the school playing field at any time. Also, the school field is not open to the public during term times whilst the school is open.

SAVE OUR SCOUTS!

ave you seen all the press recently about how good volunteering is for your mental and physical health and how rewarding it can be? I hope so! We love giving our scouts fantastic opportunities, exciting experiences and skills for life that stay with them forever. But this can only be done with a team of brilliant adults willing to provide a little time each week.

At 1st Hampton-in-Arden we are now in a critical position regarding adult help. Our current leadership team, due to a number of reasons, is losing a few members in the summer. Without adults coming forward to get involved we will have to close our Beaver and Cub packs.

Volunteers do not need to be able to attend every week or even attend any sessions. Some volunteers enjoy attending and supporting the young people in activities, other are more comfortable with planning and don't enjoy the practical aspects. **Both are equally needed.**

The best scenario is to have a small 'team' of volunteers who work together to plan and/or deliver scouting, limiting the time required of each member. We have run a number of our sections in this way. Although the critical position is with the Beaver and Cub sections, if you would prefer to volunteer to help at Scouts then that is equally welcome as we may be able to move team members around.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY - 12TH NOVEMBER 2023

An early reminder that this year's Remembrance Day service and procession will be on **Sunday 12th November**. As with previous events the **High Street will be closed to through traffic between 10.00am and 12.00 noon** to allow the procession from the church to the War Memorial to proceed safely. Residents will be able to access the Recreation Ground via Shadowbrook Lane (depending on the ongoing road closures on Catherine-de-Barnes Lane at that time).

Marshalls will be deployed to control traffic. If any residents would like to volunteer to be a marshal on the day, then please contact the Parish Clerk.

M42 JUNCTION 6 - SOLIHULL ROAD RE-OPEN!

Solihull Road has now reopened after a **2 year closure!** This is a relief to both village residents and businesses. However, Catherine de Barnes Lane is now closed to through traffic for the remainder of this year at least as construction proceeds for the new link road up to the Clock Roundabout.

AIRPORT NOISE ACTION PLAN CONSULTATION

As part of its legal obligation under the Environmental Noise Regulations, Birmingham Airport is creating and consulting local communities on its 2024-2028 Noise Action Plan. The Plan presents updated noise mapping contours, reports on previous actions and sets new and revised actions.

HS2 NEWS

Construction continues on HS2 and at present the only effects on the Parish are the occasional one-way lights on Meriden Road and the overnight closures on Diddington Lane. Construction of the Blythe Valley viaduct is due to start in earnest later this month with piling for the viaduct bases and abutments. No further news yet on the final design for the northern junction of Diddington Lane with the A452 – we are still waiting to see how the safety concerns of this junction will be covered. We will keep you posted!

TRAFFIC CALMING AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY UPDATE

- The new gateway on Solihull Road as you enter Hampton-in-Arden is now in place.
- Within the village the other outstanding measures (raised table at the existing gateway on Meriden Road and the new tables close to the station) will be constructed later this year.
- The design of the average speed cameras is on-going with installation due this financial year.
- In Catherine-de-Barnes we understand that Solihull MBC Highways are in detailed discussions with National Highways (NH) regarding the proposed traffic calming measures to be included under NH's designated funds scheme.

The examination of Solihull's Local Plan review remains paused pending the publication of the updated National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). As a result the process of completing our updated Neighbourhood Plan is held up. Our Plan has to be in conformance to the Local Plan and therefore until we know what that Plan looks like it is not prudent to continue the process. We will keep you posted with our progress.

CATNEY CHRISTMAS CRAFT FAIR - A DATE FOR YOU DIARY!

The Catney Christmas Craft Fair will take place on the 25th November between 11am and 3pm at Catherine-de-Barnes Village Hall. The fair is a social event, which brings in visitors and raises funds for the village hall. Many people come in for a browse, a chat and tea and homemade cakes.

We are looking for local people with talents of all sorts and I am hoping that there may be Hampton-in-Arden residents who have craft skills and would like to exhibit and sell their wares. - **A Warm Welcome:** As part of offering a warm welcome to everybody who comes through our door, Hampton Library are providing both warm and cold drinks to library customers. There is no charge for this, but donations are welcome if you wish.
- Summer Reading Challenge 2023, Ready, Set, Read! Every year, the Summer Reading Challenge helps children to keep up reading through the summer holiday. They just need to read six books of their choice to complete the challenge and there are rewards along the way to make it extra fun. This year, the theme is 'Ready, Set, Read!' a sports and gamesthemed challenge, presented by libraries and the Reading Agency in partnership with the Youth Sport Trust. Children can join the Summer Reading Challenge any time in the summer, and if they're not already a library member, all you need is something official with an adult quarantor's name and address.

PARKING IN HAMPTON IN ARDEN PARISH

Recent public meetings have highlighted a number of parking issues within the Parish. The recent reopening of the Beeches as Soho Tavern in Hampton in Arden has increased these parking issues. Your Parish Council then agreed a series of measures that we believe will address these issues and improve safety for all road users. These proposals can be viewed on our website.
