Neighbourhood Plan (NP) Review Update

As you are aware, the process for securing a new Neighbourhood Plan is currently stalled because of the situation with Solihull Emerging Local Plan which is also stalled at the examination stage. Any Neighbourhood Plan has to be in general conformity with an adopted Local Plan. The current Local Plan was adopted in 2013 and it makes no sense for our new plan to be in line with that plan. Representatives on the working group are planning to meet with senior representatives involved with the Local Plan process at Solihull MBC to establish what other options may be open to us.

As things stand at the moment it could well be 2025 before we get any movement in the process. Obviously the greatest concern is the consultations and surveys previously undertaken could well be treated as out of date and need to be redone. **More news in the next issue.**

CLIMATE CHANGE COMMITTEE UPDATE

As part of the Parish Council's commitment to reducing our impact upon climate change, in June 2024 Councillor Roger Waring is attending a presentation titled 'Unleashing the Power of Local Councils to Take the Climate Emergy' arranged by the National Association of Local Councils. The speakers come from various

organisations that have successfully implemented action plans to combat the known effects. It is hoped that we can adopt similar plans to those experienced elsewhere. As an example, the Parish Council will press for the planting of trees as an important feature of any new housing developments.

FOOTPATHS IN THE PARISH

Our Parish Council Public Rights of Way representative (Roger Waring) is continuing to survey as many paths as possible in order to identify essential and important maintenance issues that affect our ability to use our paths comfortably and safely. Some success has been achieved, such as the clearance of the path between Hampton Green and The Crescent and clearance of creeping vegetation and grass along the whole of the footway from Diddington Lane to Kenilworth Road. But more needs to be done. The Parish Council recognises that Solihull MBC are limited in their ability to service all of the works that we consider necessary. As a result, it is expected that in next year's budget, a modest allowance will be made to cover these sorts of works, in Catherine-de-Barnes as well as around Hampton.

As part of our common desire to get people out and about and walking more, we are very pleased to announce the **creation of a new footpath** that will remove the need to walk a busy section of Shadowbrook Lane. Roger has successfully lobbied National Highways to fund this project. **Well done Roger!** This permissive path will start opposite the exit from Hampton Manor Grounds, and will allow access to Bickenhill via the Sports ground, the arboretum, the wildflower meadow, and the Trust woodland. The works are expected to be completed in June.

TRAFFIC CALMING AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

TRAFFIC CALMING

- Solihull MBC have now confirmed that the additional speed table at the Meriden Road Gateway will be installed at the end of May together with additional works close to the station.
- The average speed cameras for the High Street and Meriden Road will be installed in June/July Solihull MBC will carry out the work when funding is received from HS2.
- Approval from National Highways is expected very soon for the proposed traffic calming in Catherine-de-Barnes. Again Solihull MBC will carry out the work when funding is received, this time from National Highways.

PARKING

- Solihull MBC will be holding a formal public consultation during the summer regarding parking issues in both villages and proposed counter measures. We will keep you updated!
- We appreciate that some streets and roads in Catney are narrow and parking is difficult. If you have to park using the footpath-please bear in mind that mums with prams/buggies and people using mobility scooters need to be able to get past. **Thank you.**

SHARED USE OF PUBLIC HIGHWAYS

Throughout the Parish there are a number of roads with no separate footways which means that all road users – vehicles, pedestrians, cyclists, horse riders – have to use the road itself. We would like to remind everyone that all these road users have equal rights to use the roads – it's known as shared use. Motorists especially please note and slow down to pass other users.

CATHERINE DE BARNES NEWS



NEWS FROM THE GEORGE FENTHAM TRUST

● **Fentham Hall:** The Trust owns and manages the Fentham Hall and meeting rooms near the Doctor's surgery. The main Fentham Hall building comprises the Fentham Hall, a large airy space with a stage, lights, sprung dance floor and even a Compton Organ which rises out of the stage. The Organ Society host monthly concerts at the hall, which is also used by local organisations for meetings and classes and can be hired for weddings and parties, with the Hall being licensed for civil ceremonies. The building also includes a kitchen and bar and the smaller Arden Room, which has recently been refurbished and is now a light and airy room with views over the fields. - **A Warm Welcome:** As part of offering a warm welcome to everybody who comes through our door, Hampton Library are providing both warm and cold drinks to library customers. There is no charge for this, but donations are welcome if you wish.
